



Distillery Licences – Guidelines and Application

A Distillery licence may be issued to an establishment licensed under the laws of Canada to produce spirits.

If you are interested in establishing a Distillery in Newfoundland and Labrador please use the following as a **guideline** of the requirements. Please note: other agencies or departments may require information further to that which is listed below.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">Completed application for a Distillery licence (see attached) Please note if you intend to sell spirits for consumption on your premises, you will require a Lounge Licence (separate application).

<ul style="list-style-type: none">One set of floor plans, drawn to scale on paper no larger than 8.5" x 14", outlining the proposed licensed area, including dimensions of clearly identified rooms (including storage)	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">A current signed copy of a lease or purchase agreement, or another document that verifies ownership and/or legal possession of the establishment (e.g., Property Tax Bill)	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">If incorporated, please provide Notice of Directors form, The Corporations Act (Form 6)	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">Written approval from the Canada Revenue Agency (see CRA section below)	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">Verification of Food Establishment Licence (see Government Modernization and Service Delivery section below)

NLC Product Approvals and Reporting	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">As you move through the process, it is important for you to consult with NLC's Merchandising Department, which is responsible for the products approved and sold by distilleries. For more information on NLC's listing process, please contact the Category Manager (Spirits), Scott Collins, at (709) 724-3516 or scott.collins@nliquor.com.Product pricing is based on NLC's pricing policy. A fixed and variable markup component is applied to your cost which is the NLC markup. For more information on pricing, please contact Igor Volobuiev at (709) 724-1187 or igor.volobuiev@nliquor.com.Distillery licensees will be required to file a monthly commission report to the NLC which tracks your inventory, production and sales and will detail the amount of commission due to the NLC. Commission due to NLC must be paid monthly in accordance with policy. Adequate records to support amounts reported are to be maintained. Licensed distilleries are also subject to audits by the NLC.

<p>Canada Revenue Agency (CRA)</p> <p>CRA issues the licence to produce alcohol in Canada and will assist with any production questions you may have. For more information, please call 1-888-327-7999.</p>	
<p>Government Modernization and Service Delivery</p> <p>To operate a distillery, a Food Establishment Licence is required. Government Modernization and Service Delivery conducts health inspections at all food establishments in the province, including distilleries. For more information, please call (709) 729-2104.</p> <p>The proposed distillery will also need approvals for Buildings Accessibility and Fire and Life Safety. For more information, please call (709) 729-1038.</p>
